WHEN AND HOW TO BURN

YOU MUST HAVE A PERMIT FOR ALL FIRES INCLUDING INCINERATORS (UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE BUSH FIRES ACT)

Who can burn

Effective July 2012 only those properties zoned rural residential throughout the district or are 4,000 sqm or greater and located south of the prolongation of William Street, Dawesville will be able to obtain a permit to burn.

How to obtain a permit

Permits to burn can be obtained from the City's Administration Building, 3 Peel Street, Mandurah or Falcon eLibrary and Community Centre, corner Flavia Street and Cobblers Road, Falcon.

BARBECUES

Gas and electric barbecues are permitted at any time under certain conditions. Check before lighting up.

Solid Fuel barbecues are prohibited on days of catastrophic, severe or extreme fire danger.

CAMPFIRES

Solid fuel campfires are completely banned in the Mandurah district at all times of the year.



Firebreak and Fuel Hazard Reduction Notice 2012/2013

As a land owner you have a responsibility to manage your property to reduce the risk of fire.



YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS A LAND OWNER IN THE CITY OF MANDURAH

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or owned and occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this Notice, to the satisfaction of Council or its duly authorised officers.

This work must be carried out by 17 November 2012 or within 14 days of becoming the owner or owner occupier, should this be after that date and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 31 May 2013.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this Notice may be issued with an infringement notice or prosecuted. Where the owner fails to comply with the requisitions of the Notice, the Council or its duly authorised officers or contractors will carry out the required work at the cost of the owner or owner occupier.

In addition, you may be required to carry out further works which may be deemed necessary and specified by way of a separate written notice forwarded to the address shown on the City of Mandurah rate records for that land.

FIREBREAK VARIATION

If it is considered for any reason impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this Notice, or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply in writing to the City of Mandurah or its duly authorised officers, no later than 1 November 2012, for alternative positions, or other methods of fire prevention on your land. If permission is not granted, you must comply with the requirements of the Notice.

WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

OCCUPIED OR UNOCCUPIED LAND LESS THAN 2023m²

Where the area of the land is less than 2023m² remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees and shrubs from the whole of the land. If mowing or slashing is carried out, then the height of the vegetation must not exceed, as far as reasonably practicable, 40mm over the entire area of land. A four metre firebreak is not acceptable.

OCCUPIED OR UNOCCUPIED LAND 2023m² AND OVER

When the area of land is 2023m² and over, provide a trafficable mineral earth firebreak at least four metres wide, with a vertical height clearance of 4.2m;

- 1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the said land.
- 2. Immediately surrounding all outbuildings erected on the said land.

FIREBREAK AND FUEL HAZARD REDUCTION NOTICE

Council forwards a copy of this Notice each year to all property owners. The Notice is also published in a local newspaper circulating the district. Additional copies are obtainable at Council offices. The requirements of this Notice are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties, but the district generally.

All properties are to comply with this Notice by 17 November 2012. Rangers will inspect all properties from 18 November 2012 to ensure they comply with Council's requirements.

Penalties (Bush Fires Act)

penalty of \$10,000 plus costs.

If you do not meet your responsibilities as outlined in this brochure, the following penalties may apply:

Failure to maintain four metre firebreaks or remove flammable material	.\$250
Offence relating to lighting fire in open air	.\$250
Burning during prohibited burning times	\$250
Failure of occupier to extinguish a fire	\$250
Refusal to state name and address or giving false name and address	.\$100
Failure to produce permit to burn	\$100
Ultimately you could be liable for a maximum
